In the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester, you will complete one of the following two options as a research project. The grade you receive will count for 40% of your 4<sup>th</sup> marking period grade:

- 1. The Veterans History Project (through the Library of Congress)
- 2. Multimedia Project: "Historical Ignatian Knights The Quest for Social Justice in America"

## The Big Picture

- Your project will ultimately be due on the next to final day of the school year
- You will have to identify which project you will complete by the time you return from winter recess (late February)
- Each project has a series of intermediate due dates, which are as follows:
  - o The Veterans History Project
    - Step 1: Biographical Data Form (due the last day of the 3<sup>rd</sup> M.P.)
    - Step 2: List of Interview Questions (due on the first Monday in April)
    - Step 3: Record your interview and complete the Veteran and Interviewer Release Forms (due on the first Monday in May) – submit to Mr. Ruppert for verification
    - Step 4: Complete Audio And Video Recording Log Sheet (due the Thurs. before "7 day)
    - Step 5: Submit your Full Interview Transcript and any Manuscript Data Sheets and / or Photograph Logs, as well as a mailing receipt to the L.O.C., by the next to last day of the 4<sup>th</sup> M.P.
  - o Historical Ignatian Knights The Quest for Social Justice in America
    - Step 1: Reflective Essay (due on the last day of the 3<sup>rd</sup> M.P.)
    - Step 2: Initial Top 10 List (due the first Monday in April)
    - Step 3: Revision #1 to Top 10 List (due on the first Monday in May)
    - Step 4: Revision #2 to Top 10 List (due the Thursday before "7 day")
    - Step 5: Complete your "Research Interview" and Final Written Reflection Piece by the next to last day of the 4<sup>th</sup> M.P.
